Kinesiology

Program Overview

Langara's <u>Kinesiology Department</u> offers a <u>Kinesiology Diploma</u>, which is a two-year university-transfer program that allows students to continue toward the completion of a university degree in disciplines such as kinesiology, physical education, human kinetics, or other interdisciplinary studies.

The Kinesiology department courses range from introductory level through to 2nd-year university transfer in a wide range of topics, including exercise physiology, functional anatomy, motor learning and control, sport psychology, sports medicine, biomechanics, fitness and training, growth and development, health and lifestyles, and leisure and sports studies.
