5. INFORMATION ITEMS

a) 2007-08 Budget – Draft 1

- D. Douglas noted that the current year budget was reviewed at the College Board Administration and Finance committee meeting held on November 20, 2006, and the freeze on capital was removed. She requested that each department ensure that any items purchased be received before March 31, 2007.
- D. Douglas distributed a document entitled "Langara Council, Draft 1 2007-08 Budget, November 21, 2007" (a copy is attached to these minutes). She noted that tuition and parking revenues are down but should be offset by additional revenue from investments. She noted that "Salaries increases for 06/07" should read "07/08". She further reviewed the draft budget and noted that the total result is a net shortfall of \$1.5M. D. Douglas noted that budget confirmation sheets were distributed on November 20, 2006.
- D. Douglas distributed a document entitled "Operating Capital Plan 2006/07 to 2010/11" (a copy is attached to these minutes). She requested that members review columns "2007/08 Request Estimate" through to "2010/11 Request" and identify individual department lines for items that could be stretched out over more years and bring these items to the next Langara Council meeting for discussion.

D. Douglas noted that a revised enhancement list will be distributed for discussion at the next Langara Council meeting.

ACTION: D. Douglas Agenda Item

D. Douglas noted that at a meeting held on November 20, 2006, the Administration and Finance Committee recommended an increase in the credit cap in Career and Vocational

programs from 15 to 18 credits, which will provide additional revenue of approximately \$150,000. The College Board approved this recommendation at its meeting held on November 20, 2006. She noted that further analysis will be done relative to this issue prior to Fall 2007.

b) Campus 2020

- D. Douglas noted that J. Hooton attended Campus 2020: Thinking Ahead provincial symposium on the future of B.C.'s post-secondary education system on October 31st and November 1, 2006 and asked him to give a brief report on the event.
- I. Hooton noted that Campus 2020 was initiated by the Provincial Government in order to obtain information to help develop a New Policy Framework on Post-Secondary Education. Participation was by invitation and included students, faculty members, educational leaders, public and private educational institutions, and businesses. Geoff Plant, Special Advisor and former Attorney General, will present a report to the Premier in the spring of 2007, containing recommendations based on input to Campus 2020 from experts, students and the general public. There were two excellent Keynote speakers: Andrew Ramlo, Director of Urban Futures Inc., who presented a provocative look at B.C.'s changing demographic and economic landscape between now and 2020, and how it affects post-secondary education, reinforcing the work of L. Xiong; and, Michael Griffin, a Commonwealth Scholar (Oxford University), a Governor-General of Canada's Academic Medalist, and a UBC graduate, who made a presentation based on his doctoral research which wove ancient philosophy, new digital media, culture, higher education, and politics. A copy of his discussion paper "E-Learning and Beyond" is available from D. Falcon for anyone interested. Five assumptions for the policy framework were identified which include: public support; value for everyone; service will range from personal to direct support for society i.e. research; right of individuals to make choices; and, value of planning. The conclusion of the symposium was led by four expert panelists: Sara Diamond, President, Ontario College of Art and Design; Dr. Harold Shapiro, past-president of Princeton University; Dr. Graham Smith, a prominent Maori education activist; and, recently appointed International Advisor, Thomas L. Wood, Senior Advisor to the President, Quest University Canada, and the President of the Asia Pacific Institute of the Tec de Monterrey (ITESM).
- L. Cullen noted that Education Council will submit a letter to the Ministry emphasizing a quality education, accessibility, and cost perspective.
- D. Douglas noted that the B.C. College Presidents have completed a submission and will meet on December 15, 2006 to present it.
- D. Pepper noted that the Council of Post-Secondary Library Directors has been working with Kate Cotie from the Ministry of Advanced Education to put more "teeth" into the Program Resources section of DQAB Guidelines, requiring that private universities have adequate library resources in place to support the program.

c) Campus Rezoning

D. Douglas noted that City Council approved the rezoning at a Public Hearing held on Tuesday, November 14, 2006 and that a number of agreements must be in place prior to enactment.

There being no further discussion, the meeting was adjourned at 1020 hours.
