A portion of this clinical experience will be devoted to working with individuals with dementia. Students have the opportunity to gain expertise and confidence with the role of the Health Care Assistant within a residential care facility.

Note: This course will be offered concurrently with theory classes in the second term. Students must not register for other classes on practice days.
